Building Update



The Winchburgh Academy building is progressing well and ahead of schedule. WLC will receive keys to the building on **Friday 8th July.** From that date, we will have access to the building, although ongoing WLC property services work will be ongoing including IT installation services etc between then and August.

The Sports Block facility will be available slightly after this date, on **Monday 1**st **August** (the same day as the keys for Holy Family Primary School will be handed over to WLC).

Relevant staff have enjoyed a number of visits to the school site. All newly appointed Acting PTs have visited the site recently and plans are in place to provide a tour for P6 & P7 pupils from Winchburgh PS on **Friday 13**th **May** and on **Friday 20**th **May** for all other primary 7 children joining our school community in August.

Following the first WLC pupil placement deadline (21st March), we have an expected first cohort of **45**, however, we are now led to believe that this may have increased to **47** as of 26th April 2022. It is anticipated that this may rise slightly between now and August. This includes almost all young people who are currently in P7 at Winchburgh Primary. Most young people in P7 at Holy Family are joining our community as are some from other primary schools such as St. Josephs PS, Linlithgow, Whitdale PS, Gylemuir PS and St Nicholas PS. Initial plans are to **create 3 S1 classes for our first school session** – beginning with **approximately 15/16 young people in each class**. School staff will be working very closely with Primary HTs, P7 pupils and parents/families to design class lists throughout the month of May.

Start up costs are agreed and our new Area Support Business Manager, Jennifer Brydon is working closely with Catherine Campbell and all Winchburgh Academy staff to ensure appropriate resources are in place at the earliest opportunity including subject specific materials and equipment. Each staff member has been allocated a laptop and will have access to an Ipad in the near future.

20 Netbooks are ordered for learners to use and **20 Ipads** are ordered for learners to use from August 2022. Our IT system supports use of personal devices and young people will be encouraged to bring/use these as appropriate learning resources in the first instance. Any young person who does not have access to a device will be given access to one.

We are continuing to work closely with Morrison's Construction for staff to visit the site as appropriate to inform future planning and we are also continuing discussions with the Graphic Design Team – SuperGraphics.

Morrison's Construction preference is that parents/families do not visit the site until the keys are officially handed over to WLC on Friday 8th July.

Identity Update



Following a host of surveys, focus group meetings, parent council discussions, Q & A sessions and workshops with pupils, our consultation regarding our school badge and school tie has now been completed.

We are delighted to introduce the confirmed Winchburgh Academy official badge and school tie.





Our school colours will be **navy** with a trim of **sky blue** and **white**. The symbols on the badge represent the following:

- The Forth Rail Bridge local inspiration to world leading engineering (STEM) and provides a link from one place to another (bridging communities together)
- The **Barge steering wheels** represent the link to local landmark and heritage- and also represents **'all steering together in the right direction'** (a vital component of our mantra for Winchburgh Academy)
- The **lantern** provides a link to the proud **mining heritage** of Winchburgh and ties in with our school motto (see below)
- Niddrie Castle represents another important link to local and national history
- The tree represents growth and future and it also reflects that the new Winchburgh Community Hub where the school building proudly sits, is designed on the concept of 'schools in the park' as developed by the architects.
- The **book** represents **learning** the most vital component of the purpose of our school community
- The reference to **2022** is obviously the year the school opened
- The Latin motto translates in English to 'Kindle the Lamps of the World' linking the historic mining heritage of Winchburgh and the work of a local poet to what we want our young people and community members to continue to do bring light to the world and contribute to progress, positivity and the future.

The **school tie** will be a **registered Tartan** of Scotland – named **'The Winchburgh Academy Tartan'.** An excellent legacy to set, acknowledging the opening of our new school.

The school blazer will be **navy blue** and our initial uniform supplier is Borders Embroidery Uniforms **(BEUniforms)**

We are continuing to consult with our community about further/modern aspects of our school uniform and will continue to work with our community on that.
