Other Information/FAQs

When will my child see their S3 timetable?

Although they will not begin their S3 timetable until the first day back in the new session (August 2024), students will be issued with their S3 timetable in June prior to the summer holidays.

When will the new timetable start?

At the beginning of the new session in August 2024.

What happens in the event of my child not being able to access all their first choice subjects?

A relevant member of staff will arrange a discussion with your child and be in contact with you at the earliest opportunity to discuss further with you.

When filling in the personalisation form, can I choose the same subject as a number 1 choice in more than one column?

No as we are aspiring to provide you with your first choice in each column as far as possible.

If Physics (for example) is my 2nd choice in the Science column can I choose it as a 1st choice in one of the additional choice columns?

Yes you can.

When will I know what the final options are for My Academy in addition to Duke of Edinburgh?

Following further consultation, this will be shared with students and parents/carers prior to students confirming their choices.

If my child decides after S3 that they want to study a subject they haven't done in S3, are they able to do this?



Yes, courses are designed to support this as much as possible.

How many subjects is my child likely to study in S4 (Senior Phase – National Qualifications)?

Whilst we are still in the early stages of designing/consulting on our senior phase curriculum, most schools study 7 subjects in S4.

If my child and I feel that we need some additional support/guidance to choose courses, can I contact someone at the school?

Yes, of course. Please contact your child's PSR teacher. Mrs. Oliver will be in contact with some parents/carers in the first instance as appropriate to arrange a meeting or a discussion to complete the personalisation form together.

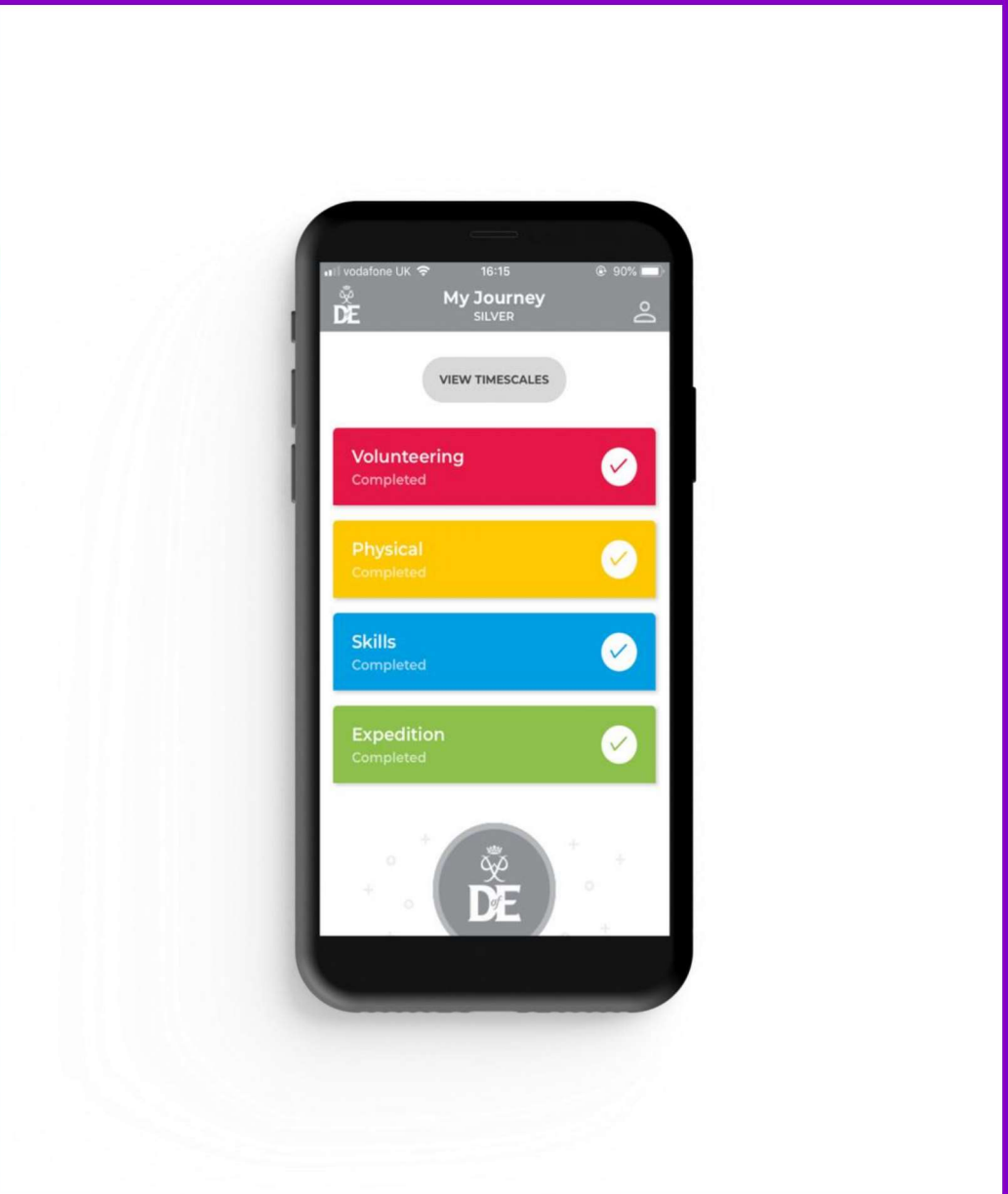
